

Supplementary Table S1. Sub-lobar regions. Each source was localised in one of the following sub-lobar regions. If the result of ESI showed multiple sources or was not clear, source location was defined as “non-localizable/diffuse” (if possible, right/left descriptors were added). If the source was located on the border of a clear lesion or cavity, the location was defined as “perilesional”
